#### AGENCY MISSION

Southwest Texas Junior College is a comprehensive, public, two-year college serving eleven counties in southwest Texas. College programs and services provide accessible, affordable, high-quality post-secondary education that prepares students to: 1) enter the job market, 2) transfer to senior colleges and universities, 3) pursue their professional and personal goals. Through its programs and services, the college equitably provides higher education opportunities and supports the economic growth of the community.


Southwest Texas Junior College (SWTJC) is a two-year college located in the extreme southwest corner of Texas and serves a vast region encompassing eleven counties (Dimmit, Edwards, Frio, Kinney, La Salle, Maverick, Medina, Real, Uvalde, Val Verde, and Zavala) – the largest geographical service territory in the state. SWTJC is an open-door college providing quality associate degree and certificate programs with campuses located in Uvalde, Crystal City, Pearsall, and the border cities of Del Rio and Eagle Pass. For sixty-one years SWTJC has provided high quality post-secondary education and training opportunities for the residents of Southwest Texas. SWTJC is the only community college in the area and is the only state community college that provides post-secondary educational opportunities to a region this large.

Since 2001, SWTJC has received diminishing state support as a percentage of total funds. As a rural college, SWTJC has a low tax base where each \$0.01 in tax rate generates only \$140,000 in revenue – the current rate is \$0.13 per \$100 valuation.

SWTJC is cognizant of the financial strains being experienced statewide and is actively utilizing cost-saving and more efficient processes to deliver our core mission-instruction. Despite our cost efficiencies, SWTJC has had to resort to raising tuition rates in order to maintain our high level of service.

However, SWTJC stands committed to provide accessible and affordable post-secondary educational opportunities throughout our rural service area. We have embraced the new accountability standards and communicated to our faculty and staff that we are accountable for our students' success. Our commitment to provide quality affordable education is evidenced by our partnership with Sul Ross State University - Rio Grande College to develop a cooperative \$10,000 bachelor's degree.

In order to support this marked shift in higher education, we endorse the \$1.968 billion request for student success funding for the 2014-2015 biennium and recommend, as the July 16, 2012 letter from the Texas Association of Community Colleges outlines, that our funding for community colleges be appropriated through three strategies: Core Operations, Student Success Points, and Contact Hour Funding.
