President's Report September 2016

Construction

Eagle Pass Technical Campus – We will schedule an open house for the Chittim Technical Campus for October

Crystal City Library – Construction is moving on the project. We are pleased with the progress on the library.

Partnerships

Middle Rio Grande Development Council – We partnered with MRGDC to submit a Department of Labor grant, which would provide tuition assistance to dislocated workers. Attended the annual meeting in August, had opportunity to visit with Representative Andy Murr, and Superintendents – Ball, Seals, Allen, & Gonzales.

Other

Fall Enrollment – Fall numbers look tremendous; head count increase of 15%, semester credit hours increase of 12 % both compared to last fall. Compared to last base year (Fall 14) contact hours increased by 11%.

Ad Valorem Taxes – Had relatively quiet public hearings, at the second public hearing we heard from two Uvalde businessmen that strongly support the college, and recognize the college as good stewards of taxpayer's funds.

Palomino Festival – This year's festival was again a great success. Many thanks to all the volunteers and sponsors that help make this festival great, and a special thanks to the leadership of Wade Carpenter, in organizing this event. \$25,000 was provided to the Los Palominos Scholarship this year.
